OKOH RIRAKU captures the quiet beauty of Japanese nature in each stick of incense. Inspired by seasonal flowers, aromatic woods, and traditional culture, each fragrance creates a calm and contemplative atmosphere. Light a stick to mark a gentle pause in your day, to welcome a guest, or to bring serenity into your space.

• How to Use

- Light the tip of the incense stick.
- Gently blow out the flame and allow it to smolder.
- Place the included holder on a non-flammable dish and insert the incense stick upright.

• Caution

- This product is not food. Do not ingest.
- Keep out of reach of children and pets.
- Never leave burning incense unattended.
- Ensure the ember is fully extinguished after use.
- Keep away from flammable materials.
- Use on a stable, non-flammable surface away from drafts.
- Store in a cool, dry place away from heat and direct sunlight.
- Burning time varies (approx. 12–15 minutes).

• Fragrance Collection

Agarwood (Jinkoh)

A precious aromatic wood once presented to the Imperial Court, as recorded in ancient Japanese texts. Deep, rich, and dignified with profound elegance.

Hinoki

Used in historic Japanese architecture for centuries. A clean, calming wood fragrance with refreshing clarity.

Cherry Blossom (Sakura)

A timeless symbol of Japan since the Heian era. Softly sweet and gracefully floral.

Osmanthus (Kinmokusei)

A beloved autumn bloom in Japan. Sweet citrus-floral notes reminiscent of golden blossoms in fall air.

Sandalwood (Byakudan)

Renowned aromatic wood used in carvings and incense. Refined, smooth sweetness embodying Japanese elegance.

Gentian (Rindō)

A flower native to Japan and mentioned in The Pillow Book. Radiant with a fresh and delicate sweetness.

White Plum (Shiraume)

Blooming gracefully in the cold of winter, a symbol of vitality. Transparent and gently sweet.

Lily of the Valley (Suzuran)

Also known as the “Stairway of Fairies.” Fresh, dewy sweetness with clarity.

Pomegranate (Zakuro)

A symbol of abundance in ancient Greece and Rome. Lightly sweet with a subtle tartness.

Rose (Bara)

The queen of flowers and a symbol of love. Elegant, radiant, and beautifully refined.

Jasmine

Also known as Maturika, used in perfumes and tea. Fresh with a delicate, refined sweetness.

Hydrangea (Ajisai)

A summer seasonal flower celebrated in Japanese poetry. Fresh, cool, and transparent.

White Clover (Shirosumekusa)

A symbol of happiness. Soft and enveloping with gentle meadow sweetness.

Green Tea (Ryokucha)

A staple of Japanese culture. Calm sweetness with refreshing clarity.

Water Lily (Suiren)

Admired by Monet for its serene beauty. Elegant and mysterious with a quiet sweetness.

Lavender

Known as the “Queen of Herbs.” A fresh, gentle herbal fragrance.

Violet (Sumire)

Beloved across cultures as a symbol of renewal. Pure and softly sweet.
